African Manufacturing: A need for Data-driven Industrial Revolution.



Indigenous artisanal production (textiles, metallurgy, ceramics) driven by local knowledge and resourcefulness.



Colonial Era:

Manufacturing redirected to resource extraction; infrastructure built to export raw materials, limiting domestic industrial growth.



Historical Evolution

Post-Independence:

Import substitution policies sparked early industrialization, later challenged by structural adjustments that exposed industries to global competition.

African Manufacturing: A need for Data-driven Industrial Revolution

1

GDP Contribution:

Manufacturing contributes ~10% to many African GDPs.

Nigeria's manufacturing sector added ~ 32.3

trillion (2018–2022), averaging 9% of GDP.

Export Trends:

Key Exports: Textiles, processed foods, automotive parts, chemicals.

Major Markets: European Union, China, United States. AfCFTA aims to boost intra-African trade, targeting a \$450 billion market by 2035.

Investments:

FDI surge in Nigeria: 67% increase in 2023, reaching ~\$1.59 billion.

Continuous domestic investments in infrastructure and skills are paving the way for modern manufacturing clusters.
